

Infantry Soldier - Major Rick Kelley U.S. Army-Retired

Truly a "hero in our midst", it was an honor to interview Major Kelley. We are from the same home town, Lawrence, Massachusetts, and he went to grade school with my father at St Patrick's Grammar School, but I never had the

chance to really talk to Major Rick Kelley U.S. Army-Retired until a few weeks ago. The "tip of the spear" in the U.S. Military are our Army and Marine Infantrymen, they often call themselves 11 Bravo's. A U.S. Marine Captain once told me that the only force that can take and hold ground, is the American infantrymen. As I listened to Major Kelley speak, I was

drawn into the conversation by the respect he showed to an often maligned soldier, the American Draftee.

Having served in the comparatively better paid, "all volunteer military" myself, I had misconceptions of what the 1950-1960s era drafted U.S. soldier was like and how they lived, worked, and served our nation. Mr. Kelley cleared the air quickly, stating clearly that for the most part, the drafted American soldier served as well as the volunteer American soldier in his era.

He spoke equally as eloquently on the fighting ability of the native Vietnamese Montagnard tribesman. The U.S. Army Special Forces with whom Mr. Kelley served, thought so much of these fighters that they would go out on patrol with them, a handful of U.S. Special Forces troops fighting alongside 100 or more tribesmen. Today the largest population on these tribesmen outside of South East Asia, is in the State of North Carolina where many Special Forces Units are also based.

Originally serving in the U.S. Army as an enlisted soldier, enlisting in 1959, after graduating from Central Catholic High School in 1958 and doing a year at Newman Prep in Boston. His first choice of service was the U.S. Navy, but decided on the U.S. Army as they would allow a 36 month initial enlistment. Rick Kelley was commissioned a 2nd Lt. in Officer's Candidate School (OCS) Class 1-66. And despite trying to avoid the Navy's 48 month obligation, he ended up serving



our nation for 21 years as both an officer and enlisted man. He was the "tip of the spear", serving in the Infantry and Special Forces. While serving he earned a BA from University of Tampa, and also graduated from Suffolk Law School.

He was awarded the Bronze Star with one Oak Leaf Cluster, the Meritorious Service Medal with one Oak Leaf Cluster, Army Commendation Medal, U.S. Army Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Gallantry Cross with one Palm,

EDITORIAL: Would YOU Give Hitler More Power?

Will The Globe Follow-up on Its Workplace Abuse Article?

After decades of being begged by hundreds, if not thousands, of workplace abuse victims to report on this escalating crime, The Boston Globe finally published a superficial article on 12/30/17: “Still in the Shadows, bullying at work takes a huge toll.” For starters, it’s not in the shadows. Workplace bullying is open and everywhere, destroying individuals and

entire families as it rips through society. It is the mainstream media, including The Boston Globe, that tries to keep it in the shadows.

The article was hardly a belated confession that the paper had sidestepped this major public interest matter. It was more likely a feeble attempt at challenging the December article in The Valley Patriot “America’s New McCarthyism” that had exposed this recipient of 26 Pulitzer Prizes on its glaring omission of reporting on real victims instead of lavishly covering

unsubstantiated sexual abuse allegations against men of power.

But more to the point: will the overrated Pulitzer recipient follow up, now that the paper has acknowledged the existence of workplace bullying as the widespread crime it is? Will it conduct proper investigations and report on the ruthlessness of perpetrators and the devastating trauma it causes – as intended – its unsuspecting victims? Will it end its drawn out 15 Minute spotlight on dumb actresses in black lace and plunging neckline tease wear (as it’s called in Europe) while on a puritanism trip, and finally shine it on real crimes the public deserves to know about?

Probably not. Or at least not in the form of the comprehensive research required to properly analyze the dynamics of bullying and the roles and interests of the usual players? My reason for doubt being that the paper lives off business relationships with some of the worst offenders: corporate institutions, local government and the judiciary. Thus protecting some of the vilest criminals for self-interest rather than cautioning the public.

A corny piece followed the “Shadows” article on 01/03/18: “Dads, too, claim unequal treatment at work.” Sort of a failed demonstration of follow-up on the topic. However, this item defies the truth because people at risk don’t fit into any particular group (mothers, fathers etc.) at

all. Anyone who rubs an employer, influential co-worker or superior the wrong way for whatever reason, often completely unrelated to the employee’s performance, can be subject to tsunamis of abuse. Can get fired, denied unemployment benefits and blackballed from ever being able to land successive employment.

This happens because the employer is usually better informed and equipped than the employee, who wrongly believes that striving for excellence will keep him or her employed when in fact excellence might cause a superior to feel threatened and want that employee gone.

Employees also trust “employee handbooks” that outline the public image the employer wants to project, not the widespread prevalence of internal discrimination, deceit and tolerance of unprovoked bullying. Many employees believe that HR (Human Resources) will help them when in fact that office is paid by the employer and retained, among other things, to weed out employees internally labeled “undesirable.” And as a hostile employer moves forward in the systematic elimination process of an unwanted employee, the uninformed employee, sensing tension, attempts to prove his abilities to keep his job. However, the harder he tries, the more aggressively he is marginalized, sidelined and often served written warnings to



“WEATHER 101” WITH AL!

The Dead of Winter

Welcome to February which is the final month of meteorological winter. February can be known for big snowstorms and blizzards.

The Blizzard of 1978 occurred in early February. This storm stalled southeast of Cape Cod & the Islands which caused snow to continue falling for a couple of days. The surface low pressure system got caught in an upper level low pressure system which caused the surface low pressure to stall. When this occurs we say the lows are vertically stacked which means the surface and upper level low pressure systems were in about the same location. One of the main computer models then was the LFM (limited fine mesh model).

This model did not show an upper level low pressure system. It was weak with the upper level winds and the upper air pattern. This model did not show a blizzard developing. As a result people went to work that day as it appeared conditions would not be as worse as they were. For the commute home it was a nightmare cars were stuck on the off ramps on Route 128.

People were left stranded in their cars until front end loaders came and got their cars off the off ramps. The snow was just too deep for the snow plows. This year marks the 40th anniversary of the Blizzard of 78.

I was a student in high school at the time. After the Blizzard of 78 the LFM model was discontinued and not used anymore. Recapping this past January 2018 we saw an intense snowstorm and a lot of wind and coastal flooding on Thursday January 4.

Many areas received over a foot of snow. The strong winds off the ocean due to the intense storm produced major coastal flooding. Many coastal roads were under water and had to be closed. This storm's air pressure got down to an amazing 28.23 inches of mercury. The difference with this storm compared to the Blizzard of 78 was the fact that it was progressive kept on moving. If it ever stalled like the Blizzard of 78 this would have caused even worse conditions along the coast for coastal residences. An example of the coastal flooding with the January 4th storm was the cars at Gloucester High School which were submerged under sea water.

They all had to be towed out of the parking lot. After this storm moved away any leftover sea water outside people's homes

froze and turned to ice as colder air moved in behind the storm causing temperatures to drop. Another storm occurred on January 16 into the 17th which caused some snow but not the intensity of the January 4th storm. On January 23 warm air was supposed to get into all areas and produce rain.

However, in Northern MA and New Hampshire cold air remained trapped at the surface and would not get eroded away. As the rain fell the drops froze after hitting the ground. This is known as freezing rain. This caused icy conditions in Northern MA and New Hampshire making for dangerous driving and walking conditions. The cold air was up against the northern mountains which prevented the milder air from reaching the surface (ground).

The computer models did not show this happening. After this weather event came the January thaw (a warm period in January). The thaw was with us on January 26-28. High pressure was located off the east coast and sent warmer southwest winds into New England. During this period temperatures rose into the upper 40's and lower 50's. Due to the mild temperatures some people got the shorts out even though officially it is still winter. The mild temperatures did not last long as colder air moved back in behind a cold front on January 29. This cold front stalled south and southeast of New England.

A coastal low pressure system formed on this front and gave some parts of southern New England several inches of snow. West Wareham got 8.6 inches. North Acushnet in Bristol county MA got 8.5 inches. Kingston and Plymouth MA got 8 inches. More snow fell than was predicted. The reason for some higher than predicted snow amounts was the fluffy nature of the snow. Fluffy snow can accumulate quickly due to the fluff factor. This storm tracked well offshore along with the heaviest precip. The fluffy nature of the snow made for higher amounts. In northern MA the snow dropped off to very little amounts. In southern New Hampshire no snow fell due to the dry air at low levels of the atmosphere. This dry air caused the snow to evaporate before reaching the ground. As we start the month of February it appears the weather pattern may become more active with an increase in storms. Next month we will recap the storms that occur in February and take a look at what to expect in March. In the meantime stay warm and safe.

LOCAL CHIEFS ON OPIOIDS, VIOLENCE, & ANGELS PROGRAM

Duggan Holds Opioid Summit with Four Local Police Chiefs

Valley Patriot Publisher Tom Duggan held an opioid summit on his new show PAYING ATTENTION! with four area police chiefs. From left to right above are: Tom Duggan, Methuen Police Chief Joe Solomon, Boxford Police Chief James Riter, Haverhill Police Chief Alan DeNaro, and North Andover Police Chief Charles Gray, whom Duggan has frequently called a "cops' cop".

Much has been made of the Gloucester's Angel Program; what do each of you think about that?

(The Gloucester Police Department has decided to grant amnesty to any addict who comes to the station and turns in their drugs in exchange for going into a supervised drug rehabilitation program.)

CHIEF GRAY: "I've spoken to the District Attorney's Office on this and quite frankly I don't think it was done right because we don't have the authority (as police officers) to grant immunity when someone commits a crime. The program that they have is well intended, they had good intentions, but it's not by the law and therefore I don't think that you can do it for the sake of doing it. You have to have the D.A.'s office involved and on board with you before you just venture out like that."

CHIEF DENARO: I work very closely with D.A. Jon Blodgett and one of the things we discussed is that we are not allowed to make deals for the D.A.'s office. They are the prosecutory arm of this whole thing. We make the arrests but we can't just arbitrarily tell people 'we aren't going to charge you for this offense'. We can't

do that. I was never really involved in the Angel's program, which is why we started our own program; we have a sergeant, two officers and someone from NFI, a counselor who go out and try to get people into the programs. We don't have a ton of people who come into the station and knock on our door and say I need help. Usually when somebody gets caught, or they overdose, or they're involved in an arrest where you have an opportunity to circumvent that path that they are on and hopefully we can help them get straightened out.

CHIEF GRAY: Getting back to D.A. Blodgett for a minute. He actually has a program in place, a diversionary program

for drug addicts. SO, he's actually taken a lot of positive steps to make things work for us. I don't have a program in the town of North Andover, so we use the D.A.'s office. He's doing a fantastic job.

Duggan asked the chiefs if they see any spillover crimes being so close to Lawrence and if the increase in opioid use in the Valley has spiked their numbers in other violent crimes like domestic violence or armed robberies.

CHIEF GRAY: "We don't see those, per se, because the secondary crimes we are witnessing are; larcenies the breaking-and-enterings, the car breaks and those kinds of crimes. The only time we see a lot of violence when it's drug related is like when we go into a department store and they get caught, and they know they have warrants and they know they are going to jail for a few days and they know they aren't going to be able to use their drugs, they run. They fight and they make a break for it because it's better than getting caught. So any situation where they know they are going to get caught, they know they aren't going to be able to get high. The withdrawal from this drug is so powerful that to them it's worth it. That's the sad part of it. If you've ever seen someone detox in a cell for a little while, it's awful to watch."

CHIEF DENARO: My answer is entirely different. Ours are mostly gang related violence as the result of drugs. Our gangs are interchangeable with Lawrence. They freely go back and forth between communities. You are now even starting to see them going to Amesbury a little bit, but predominantly when it gets hot in Lawrence they come to Haverhill. When it's hot in Haverhill they go to Lawrence. A lot of the shootings that we've had are over drug disputes or people who didn't pay, or drug shipments that were misdirected and that type of thing. When gangs disrespect each other it leads to significant problems and a lot of them are drug related. So, our violence is significant as the result of gangs and drugs."

DUGGAN: Are you seeing that the gangs are becoming more violent and more prevalent on the streets of Haverhill like they are in Lawrence? Are you seeing major gangs?

CHIEF DENARO: I think we are; I think it's safe to say that it seems that the gang members we are dealing with today, as opposed to even a decade or 15 years ago, there seems to be less regard for human life. They don't seem to value life. It's nothing for them to take a gun and shoot

into somebody's house. The scary part is that there's no value for human life and that's very frightening for us.

CHIEF RITER: We see some on the traffic stops with motor vehicle issues that come through the town. What we do see is more service calls for the family. Going back to the other topic for a minute on the mandatory hold (for narcans recipients), I think it's good for these families. What we see is families get someone home and try to handle the problem in the home setting and when that doesn't work, they need a next step to get that person [help]. The hold gets them out of the house and gives the family a break also. A lot of times when we are talking to the families they say they don't know where to turn next. They've tried certain programs, they've tried different things and they just need someone to give them help also.

Duggan asked each chief if they could educate the public with one thing people aren't talking about what would it be.

CHIEF SOLOMON: I actually talked to a couple of real estate agents who said they are have a problem with people coming through and going through people's medicine cabinets at home showings. As people are going through the homes they are going through medicine cabinets. So not only should you not have opioids in your medicine cabinet but you should have it locked up somewhere. I always say to people, you have to have situational awareness with your family. People always say after, 'Oh, I knew something was wrong with my Lisa or Johnny'. So, I say to parents 'as soon as you see a behavioral change, a sudden change in friends, any change to their personal situation take note and be aware of it. And then you take it to the next step of exploring options and don't feel bad about going through their room when they're not at home.

CHIEF RITER: "If you know you have a problem in your family, reach out. Understand that there's a lot of people going through this problem. Make sure you reach out to a police professional, or someone who might be able to help. Get some early information."


FINEGOLD SEEKS SENATE SEAT

MASS DEP FINES LOWELL COMPANY - MassDEP Inspection Later Reveals Improper Storage of Hazardous Materials BOSTON – The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) penalized Triumvirate Environmental \$101,000 for response actions it initiated following a January 5, 2016 release from a 55-gallon tank of the solvent trichloroethylene (TCE) at the company’s Lowell facility. Triumvirate is a licensed hazardous waste treatment, storage and disposal facility (TSDF) located at 263 Howard Street in Lowell.

Triumvirate staff unloaded a punctured hazardous waste container of TCE while off-loading a vehicle, causing a release to the environment. Triumvirate staff notified MassDEP of the release, but the facility failed to obtain written permission prior to resuming its TSDF operations and failed to inspect the waste containers on this particular transportation vehicle prior to unloading.

“Triumvirate has a responsibility as a licensed hazardous waste TSDF to properly train its staff to adequately manage its waste deliveries and address spill requirements in the event of a release incident,” said Eric Worrall, director of MassDEP’s Northeast Regional Office in Wilmington. “Ensuring public safety and protecting critical environmental resources is of utmost importance and needs to be a top priority.”

In addition to the release incident, a subsequent inspection by MassDEP on September 15, 2016 observed incompatible hazardous waste containers being stored next to each other without any means of physical separation. Triumvirate has agreed to correct all the violations and will pay \$52,000 of the penalty, with the remaining \$49,000 suspended provided the company corrects all the violations and remains in compliance for two years.

OFFICE OF CAMPAIGN FINANCE RAPS SALEM STATE, BILLERICA SCHOOL COMMITTEE

Salem State University used staff time, email lists and a computer to send an email in 2017 that addressed, in part, the re-election of Salem Mayor Kim Driscoll, and appeared to promote the passage of a statewide ballot question. The university sent follow-up emails, prior to OCPF involvement, recognizing that the original email should not have addressed those election issues. The campaign finance law prohibits the use of public resources for political campaign purposes. ALSO, the Billerica School Department used public e-mail to send an informational communication to parents regarding a Dec. 2, 2017 town ballot question to influence their vote. The campaign finance law prohibits the use of public resources for campaign purposes but the OCPF did not fine or punish either of the two bad actors above. How are we supposed to expect public officials to stop breaking the law when they blatantly use public resources to affect a political campaign and suffer no consequences?

Rebuild Our Depleted Military

The Budget Control Act of 2011 necessitated budget cuts for the Defense Department which had a huge negative effect on the readiness of our military.

I quote from Alan Dowd’s article in the February 2018 issue of The American Legion Magazine.

“In 2011, the Air Force had 333,370 active duty airmen. By 2017, it had fallen to 310,000. In 2013, 31 squadrons stood down. In 2014 500 planes were to be eliminated. Just 12 percent of America’s aging bomber fleet will be able to penetrate and survive enemy air defenses.”

“In 2011, the Army’s active-duty end strength was 566,000; by 2016, it had fallen to 476,000. Only 25 percent of the Army’s combat aviation brigades are ready to deploy. Of the Army’s 58 brigade combat teams, only three could be called

upon to fight tonight.”

“Before sequestration, the Marine Corps fielded 202,100 active-duty personnel; by the end of 2016 there were only 184,000 Marines. By the end of 2016; only 41 percent of Marine aircraft were able to fly.”

“Today’s Navy has only 277 active deployable ships. According to former CNO Adm. Jonathan Greenert, we need a Navy of 450 ships. Fifty-three percent of Navy aircraft cannot fly.”

We need to fund the Defense Department with adequate budgets, probably on the order of \$700 billion to \$750 billion per year to rebuild our military and meet our national security requirements. President Trump is on board with the funding needs.

Pina Prinzivalli: “I’ll Never Vote Myself a Pay Raise;” Will Donate Salary Increases to Charity

TEWKSBURY, MA...On the one year anniversary of State Representative Jim Miceli’s vote to give himself and his colleagues \$18,000,000 worth of pay raises, Republican candidate Pina Prinzivalli announced that if elected, she will never vote herself a pay raise and will donate future increases to her base pay to charity.

“January 25th is a happy anniversary for Mr. Miceli, but not for the taxpayers,” said Prinzivalli, who formally announced her candidacy this past October. “I’m running to make our future, our priority. I’m not running to be a career politician who seeks financial perks for myself off the backs of working families in Massachusetts.”

On January 25, 2017, State Rep. Miceli voted to increase his ‘office expenses’ and stipends. An increase to his base salary had already been determined in December of 2016, due to an increase in the state’s median household income, thanks to a 1998 constitutional amendment. Between base salary, office expense, and stipends,

State Rep. Miceli saw a 23.1% jump in pay.

“Mr. Miceli was already getting a raise in base pay when he voted to add even more taxpayer dollars to his pocket. As your next State Representative, I won’t do that. In addition to voting against a pay raise for myself, anytime there’s an increase to the base pay due to the constitutional amendment, I will donate the additional money to charity,” said Prinzivalli.

Following State Rep. Miceli’s January 25, 2017 vote for the pay raises, he proceeded to support a constitutional amendment to introduce a graduated income tax in the Commonwealth (Vote- June 14, 2017). In 2016, he voted to protect funding for Sanctuary Cities (Vote- April 25, 2016).

“These three votes hurt the taxpayers of Wilmington and Tewksbury. That’s why it’s time to make our future, our priority.”

Two Lawrence Men Among 3 Gang Members Charged With Gun Running

State, local and federal law enforcement charged three members of the Latin Gangsta (sic) Disciples with illegal gun running Friday.

26 year old Jose Illaraza of Newburyport (AKA "Kae-Kae"), Bryan Torres-Almanzar, (AKA FLEX) 19, of Lawrence, and 22 year old Eric Valentin (AKA Jefe) also of Lawrence were charged with illegally dealing firearms without a license, and conspiracy to deal firearms without a license.

The three men were arrested Friday in Nashua, NH and detained following an appearance in federal court in Boston.

Illaraza is in state custody for an unrelated offense.

"I am grateful for the hard work and

resources of the United States Attorney Andrew Lelling's office," said Lawrence Police Chief Roy Vasque, "and Mickey Leadingham, Special Agent in charge of the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms (ATF) Boston Field Division, and his agent brought to this case. Federal and state partnerships, as in this case, with the ATF, will continue to be part of the Lawrence Police Department's strategic plan going forward to combat gun and gang violence."

Lawrence Mayor Dan Rivera said that today's development was a "huge step forward in combating gun violence". Rivera called Illaraza, Torres, and Valentin "dangerous individuals" and stated he was glad they were in custody.

Human Trafficking Victims Expanding Homeless Counts

Homeless population counts are now underway nationally and throughout the state sponsored by HUD and state agencies tasked with the annual census process. The goal is to identify not only numbers of homeless people but also concentrations of them so that resources and affordable housing efforts can be aligned for them. This of course is the theory in the most general terms.

But homelessness in almost any community is virtually intractable with affordable housing being the single impact driver. Add to that other dynamics such as insufficient mental health resources, substance abuse and the inability of thousands of people to secure stable employment with sufficient incomes to sustain themselves; and the problem is beyond the scope of most communities to eradicate it.

A growing homeless sub set are alien victims of human trafficking. Quite literally, people are being forced into the shadows of our communities, living outdoors, living in homeless shelters and rotating throughout a network of them, or just staying at a friend or relatives home without formal occupancy status just so they can stay invisible.

There are several forms of human trafficking: Notably, victims of sexual, domestic and even employment servitude are controlled by criminals who perpetually promote the threat of reporting an undocumented alien if they breach their confidence. Add to this sexual assault and domestic violence victims and conditions are ripe for people to run away and hide somewhere.

The national headlines don't help to alleviate the problem. With the current administration's surge in aggressive enforcement of inadequate immigration laws, the confrontational stances of local communities and federal agencies over sanctuary status and local police departments in an influx of what their role should be, flight of frightened people is increasing. This social disorganization is creating an invisible population.

A degree of relief though is remarkably available from The US Department of Homeland Security. Victims can often be the only gateway to identify and apprehend perpetrators of horrendous human trafficking crimes. The DHS recognizes that encouraging victims to come forward and support them with social services for safety, stability and eventual recovery is a critical component to conducting a successful investigation and prosecuting criminals.

Victims also have rights even if they are complicit in illegal activity such as forced or voluntary entry into the country. Victim Centered Resources are administered regionally by HSI (Homeland Security

Investigation) representatives. The DHS has numerous hotlines for information and also safe crime-tipping. This creates a marvelous opportunity for advocates, social workers, teachers, faith-based organizations and non-government/ non-profit agencies to "broker" terms between victims and federal agencies.

The DHS has an Immigration Relief program that specifically aims to stabilize foreign national victims of crime through a program called; The Blue Campaign.

These are the basic types of immigration relief 1) Continued Presence (CP) which is a form of relief where deportation is stayed if an eligible victim is part of an active investigation of a crime initiated by local police departments.

2) T or U Nonimmigrant Status also known as T or U Visa: These are longer term arrangements for waiver of deportation. T Visas are based in human trafficking and V Visas are based in a variety of domestic abuses, offenses and related serious crimes.

3) Public benefits are available to T and U Visa holders and in particular minor victims (under 18) are eligible for federal emergency resources.

4) Declaration or Certification by Law Enforcement. Local law enforcement agencies play a leading role in verifying victim status and declaring a victim eligible for protections.

Attorneys and the afore-mentioned social organizations have an opportunity to assist victims by not only assisting with application forms but also building a bridge of communication with local police. In doing so many individuals will be placed on pathways to emerge from the shadows. In fact, many T and U Visa holders eventually gain citizenship. The process is often initially tenuous but it must always start with a trusted relationship somewhere; a church volunteer, Pro-Bono-oriented attorney, social worker, even a teacher paying attention to clues of distress in a student. Working with local police who are interested in helping victims can open up doors for stabilization.

In the end, homeless population counts can begin subtracting victims of human trafficking and the ultimate goal which is set by the Department of Homeland Security - of making our communities safer - can be realized. If we tune out the contentious noise in the media and pay attention we can all contribute to addressing serious societal problems in constructive ways.



Lawrence's Rep. Moran Secures \$700K for More Lawrence Police

State Representative Frank A. Moran (D—Lawrence) today announced that a state grant the Representative filed in the state budget has resulted in almost three quarters of a million dollars in increased funding to hire more police officers in the City of Lawrence. This year was the fifth that Rep. Moran has filed this amendment to the state budget, which has resulted in Lawrence receiving \$700,000 in grant money.

"I would like to thank my colleagues Rep. DiZoglio and Rep. Matias for co-sponsoring as well as Senator L'Italien for her support in the Senate," said State Representative Frank Moran.

"As a strong supporter of our city's law enforcement, I believe the funds awarded to the Lawrence Police Department will be an effective method in maintaining stability in the department and will ensure that Lawrence attracts and retains its best officers and increases our overall safety and security," said State Representative Juana Matias.

Proactive measures from this funding could include directed patrols based

upon crime analysis and using community policing problem-solving to address community concerns. Additionally, these funds can be used to hire police recruits within and beyond this fiscal year.

In past years, the grant program has been very successful in Lawrence. The funds have allowed the city to hire additional police officers and it has seen a corresponding decrease in crime.

"This important funding will greatly help the Lawrence Police Department in its efforts to hire new officers and continue to promote public safety in our communities," said State Representative Diana DiZoglio.

The grant, administered by the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security, assists cities that spend less than \$200 per capita on its police department. Any funds awarded must be spent on restoring laid off sworn officers, retaining officers that would otherwise be laid off, restoring staffing levels due to attrition and other reasons, restoring or retaining civilian employees, or restoring enforcement-related overtime staffing.

Rep. DiZoglio To Push Mandating Detox Time for Narcan Recipients

Methuen State Representative Diana DiZoglio says she is ready to draft and introduce legislation which would require drug addicts who are given the life-saving drug NARCAN, to be committed for 15 – 30 days in a detox or treatment facility. DiZoglio made the revelation on Valley Patriot publisher Tom Duggan's Paying Attention TV Podcast.

Narcan is a drug used by first responders on people who die of an opioid overdose. Once administered, Narcan literally brings the overdose victim back from the dead.

Police chiefs from four communities appeared on the program previously and said the one thing that the legislature could do to help the opioid crisis is mandatory treatment for addicts.

"I asked them all," Duggan told DiZoglio, "if you could wave a magic wand and get some help from the legislature on

this opioid crisis, what would it be?"

They said, "listen when we go out there and Narcan someone they go to the hospital and they can check themselves out, and three hours later we are Narcanning them again. If the legislature could pass a law making it mandatory for 15-30 days to get treatment, it gives the families a break, it gives the cops a break, and it gives the person's body a chance to detox. Is that something you would introduce for our chiefs and our cops?"

"Absolutely, and I did previously introduce something similar to that with Chief Solomon. So, I am in full agreement with all the chiefs who said that. Too many times what happens is that you have somebody go in, they have the issue with overdosing, they wake them up, get them out of the overdose, and as soon as they can get up on their own two feet, they are out there looking for that high again."



BENEATH THE SURFACE

Legislation Targets Increased Cancer Rates Among Firefighters

This session I have filed a number of pieces of legislation pertaining to pressing public safety issues across the Commonwealth. I would like to highlight the following bill that I filed that just received a public hearing and excellent support from the committee and the public safety community: H.3520, An Act establishing a municipal bulk purchasing program for industrial washing machines for fire departments. This legislation would create a bulk purchasing program for extractors, which are specialized washing machines that are used to clean and reduce toxins routinely and continuously absorbed in firefighter equipment and gear.

Firefighters are at an elevated risk for cancer due to the toxic mix of carcinogens they are exposed to when responding to most fires. The high temperatures greatly elevate absorption of the carcinogens into the skin and personal protective equipment of the responders. Boston's Fire commissioner Joseph Finn has been a firefighter for 32 years and every month he

learns of another member who has been diagnosed with cancer. Over his career he has known of nearly 200 colleagues who have died from cancer.

One issue that many municipalities face is that extractors are very expensive to purchase and can cost upwards of \$9,800. This program would allow cities and town to join together in purchasing the extractors at a reduced price, making extractors more accessible to a wider range of communities.

This legislation is the result of coordination with Fire Chiefs across Massachusetts, cancer experts, and the Executive Office of Public Safety and many advocacy groups. The bill has already received the support of the Fire Chiefs of Massachusetts and the Professional Firefighters of Massachusetts, as well as The Last Call Foundation whose founder, Kathy Crosby-Bell, who came to testify at the hearing. This measure will not solve this alarming trend of increased cancer rates among our firefighters but it is an important measure that can have great impact in reducing this unacceptable trend.

The Why of the Progressive Movement

One of the more popular euphemisms of our day is the term "progressive". It is meant to have a positive connotation. Being a progressive is thought to mean being enlightened and open to the future. Is it true? Should we all become progressives? There are two important things to consider about this word, both of which make it deceiving.

First, notice that for the progressive the future is seen as a definite entity which he/she defines, and to which some people are open, while others resist. The former are the enlightened and they are "on the right side of history" while the others are on its "wrong side." It is seen as progress away from traditional thinking on basic issues.

Yet, in reality, there is no right or wrong side of history; only right or wrong choices and behaviors. We make history with our choices. Radical change is the sporadic norm in world history, often led by those with courage and vision to change its trajectory, which makes history difficult if not impossible to predict.

Secondly, the word "progress" itself is neutral. Its value depends on what one is progressing toward. Progressive tooth decay or cancer is not a good thing. Progressing in the wrong direction while driving gets you further from, not closer to, the destination.

This is the problem: 'progressive' ideology does not recognize an end, goal, or destination. Movement itself is its top value – but only if it is a movement in the opposite direction of what is traditionally known to be objective truth and goodness. There is no moral compass by which to judge this "progress" since good and evil are absent from its ideology; and this is mainly because of its aversion to truth and goodness.

Think about it. Extract justice from mercy, and truth from compassion, and you have contemporary Liberalism. Add in a dose of sarcasm and cynicism with personal attack, and you have Progressivism. Both stem from a refusal to submit to Reality - the first out of fear and the second out of anger.

Ever visit the Facebook page of a progressive friend? Chances are it will have

personal attack as its dominant theme. It is no coincidence that secular progressives as a rule disparage individuals rather than ideas, policies, or actions. Just watch any MSNBC evening show and you will see it within two minutes. It usually takes the form of ridicule and sarcasm. Currently the main target is Trump, but before that it was Bush, then Reagan, then Nixon. Sometimes it's a characterization of a "religious" person portrayed as racist, sexist, or anti-science. It is a way to channel hate, and is a universal phenomenon of the Left. But why? Let's go beneath the surface.

Hatred becomes the natural human condition in a post-Eden fallen world. It begins with hating sin and injustice, and since we succumb to our own imperfections, continues with hating self. This turns into anger, with an ironic combination of rationalizing one's own evil while blaming others for our misery. This condition demands a scapegoat, a way to channel one's own hate onto another in order to gain some semblance of peace, albeit a temporary and hollow one. This is a universal phenomenon found throughout history. Similarly, there is widespread animosity toward anyone that disagrees with the progressive agenda to make sin 'acceptable;' and the perceived leader of this opposition, often a conservative president, is routinely its target and scapegoat.

Christianity, however, provides the world with the one real Scapegoat to remedy this condition, the "Lamb of God." No longer is it necessary to hate oneself or others; in Christ's sacrifice hate and death are conquered. Yet, in rejecting Him we make our own 'progressive' retreat from Truth (Jn 14:6) and Love (1 Jn 4:8), and contribute to a culture of death. Ultimately, the 'progressive' movement is a movement away from God and His will, coupled with a deep aversion to His voice echoing throughout the centuries.



11 Yr. Old Cancer Victim Gets Royal Treatment by North Andover PD

Eleven year old Nathan Scanlon got the ride of his life last month when the North Andover Police and Cops for Kids with Cancer paid him and his family a visit in their Johnson Street home, lights and sirens blaring.

Nathan came out of his house to a line of police officers in his driveway, each giving him a high-five before he climbed into the front seat of a police car and led the procession of police cruisers to the police station.

"We are here today for an 11 year old kid with cancer," North Andover Police Chief Charles Gray told The Valley Patriot.

"We are bringing him back to the station where we want to give him some items and try to make his life a little bit better."

Arriving at the police station, Nathan and his family were brought into the back door "this is the door police officers use when we come to work" one officer told him. Once inside, Chief Gray thanked Nathan telling him that the police consider themselves pretty brave "but you are braver than all of us here today, we want you to know that".

Nathan and his family were given a check from Cops for Kids with Cancer in the amount of \$5,000 to help them with some of the expenses associated with taking time out of work, travel into Boston for treatment, etc.

Stacy Abato, Vice President of Cops for Kids with Cancer told the Valley Patriot that her organization goes through a screening process to select families who have children with cancer.

She said that the families of kids with cancer are too often met with unexpected time out of work, transportation costs to and from treatment, and supplies needed at home for the child.

Chief Gray and Ed McNelley, a retired Boston Police Officer, also presented Nathan with some presents to brighten his day and talked about the importance of the Cops for Kids with Cancer program.

Superintendent Gets High Marks from Methuen School Committee

METHUEN SCHOOL COMMITTEE

I have written numerous times that the City of Methuen is truly fortunate to have Superintendent Judy Scannell at the helm as the leader of Methuen Public Schools. Members of the school committee completed their annual evaluations of Superintendent Scannell in December and as expected, Superintendent Scannell received high marks for her performance.

The Education Reform Act of 1993 mandated that school committees across the Commonwealth evaluate their school district superintendents on annual basis. In December, members of the Methuen school committee evaluated Superintendent Judy Scannell using the instrument recommended by the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. It is my belief that this instrument, like the tool used to evaluate teachers, does not do our

Superintendent justice, but she received glowing reviews nonetheless. To her credit, Superintendent Scannell insisted that the committee evaluate her using almost the same instrument used to evaluate teachers.

Superintendent Scannell was evaluated in four standards: (1) Instructional Leadership; (2) Management and Operations; (3) Family and Community Engagement; and (4) Professional Culture. She was rated using the following four indicators:

1 Point Unsatisfactory = Performance on a standard or overall has not significantly improved following a rating of Needs Improvement or performance is consistently below the requirements of a standard or overall and is considered inadequate, or both.

2 Points Needs Improvement/Developing = Performance on a standard or overall is below the requirements of a standard or overall but is not considered to be Unsatisfactory at this time. Improvement is neces-

sary and expected.

3 Points Proficient – Proficient practice is understood to be fully satisfactory. This is the rigorous expected level of performance.

4 Points Exemplary = A rating of Exemplary indicates that practice significantly exceeds Proficient and could serve as a model of practice regionally or statewide.

In the area of Instructional Leadership, Superintendent Scannell received an overall committee rating of 3.5.

In the area of Management and Operations, Superintendent Scannell received an overall committee rating of 3.8.

In the area of Family and Community Engagement, Superintendent Scannell received an overall committee rating of 3.7.

In the area of Professional Culture, Superintendent Scannell received an overall committee rating of 3.7.

The above review led to an overall performance rating of 3.675.

Congratulations to Superintendent Scannell on this excellent review. Parents and members of the community can attest to the fact that our Superintendent can be seen at nearly every Methuen Public Schools event. That means she is out and about nearly every night. It should also be noted that Superintendent Scannell has refused a cost of living raise for the past four years even though she is currently one of the lowest paid superintendents in the region. The taxpayers of Methuen are truly getting a bargain and real value with Superintendent Scannell.

Both the school committee and Superintendent Scannell are well aware that there is still much work to be done to increase Methuen's rating from a Level 3 to a Level 2, and eventually a Level 1, school district with the state. We are all committed to making that happen. Resources are limited and the school committee is trying to be fiscally responsible to the taxpayers at the same time.

Last year, in FY 2018, the School Department was the only major department in the city to reduce its operating budget. It cut its operating expenses by 2 percent. The School Department did receive a 3 percent increase in funding the year before mostly to cover mandated services. It should be noted that 81% of school dis-

tricts in the Commonwealth spend above state-mandated Foundation levels for their school systems. Historically, the City of Methuen has spent at or below Foundation levels.

In considering the Methuen schools' budget, the following facts taken from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education regarding Methuen schools should be noted:

* Bottom 15% of districts for total per pupil expenditure

* Bottom 9% of districts for per pupil expenditure for administration

* Bottom 38% of districts for per pupil expenditure for guidance and school psychologists

* Bottom 34% of districts for per pupil expenditure for classroom teachers and specialist teachers

* Bottom 5% for per pupil expenditure for instructional materials, equipment, and technology

* Bottom 20% for per pupil expenditure for operations and maintenance

* Bottom 23% for per pupil expenditure for other teaching services


All things considered, the teachers and support staff are doing an excellent job educating and providing quality services to the students of Methuen Public Schools without user fees and bus fees. Not many surrounding districts can brag about the latter.

On a personal note, I want to thank members of the Methuen School Committee for unanimously voting to elect me Secretary of the school committee for the upcoming year. I also want to congratulate my colleague Nick DiZoglio and wish him well on his election to the Vice-Chair position.

Being Maura Healey's Friend Comes with the Best Perk

Maura's friends are the luckiest.

To have the Attorney General in your corner is the best Get Out of Jail Free card. Many decisions are discretionary but can apply to mere "hoi polloi". Where is the fun in that? To be truly special your friend must break a law for you. That is when you know you are elite, member of the Inner Party, above the proles.

Methuen's Loretta Cooke is one such elite persona.

In November, Tom Duggan published his superb report from Lawrence District Court on the Halloween Day trial where Loretta tried to get a restraining order on me. Maura had not spoken in chambers to the judge, so he applied the law as required and threw Loretta out of court as she deserved.

Well, Maura soon corrected her error.

I sued Loretta for libel. Case 1782CV01510. And Maura showed up to defend her friend at public expense in a private libel case about Loretta lying to Methuen Police claiming that I am mentally unstable and stalked her with a handgun. Loretta committed a crime under MGL ch. 269 Section 13A.

Maura declared that her friend lied to Methuen Police in the course of her official duties at the state medical board and so the AG must defend Loretta at public expense.

One can argue that, this far, Maura Healey was merely engaged in discretionary decision-making. After all, the AG can declare that pistol-whipping a customer in a bar on a Saturday night is within a state trooper's official duties but a Colonel reprimanding a trooper for including a judge's daughter's statements is not within the Colonel's official duties.

Discretionary, get it?

Just like Martha Coakley never prosecuted Jared Remy for raping 14-year old Tiffany Guyette. She cared deeply about women and children, our Martha. Naturally the Massachusetts Women's Political Caucus honored her with an award after Remy then murdered a woman.

But here is where Loretta joined the truly elite. Maura broke a specific state law when she spent tax money to defend Loretta in my private libel lawsuit in civil court.

At some point when we actually supported checks and balances on the AG, our legislature passed a statute that bans the AG from representing state employees at tax payers' expense in libel cases.

MGL chapter 258, Section 10. The provisions of sections one to eight, inclusive, shall not apply to:

(c) any claim arising out of an intentional tort, including assault, battery, false imprisonment, false arrest, intentional mental distress, malicious prosecution, malicious abuse of process, libel, slander, misrepresentation, deceit, invasion of privacy, interference with advantageous relations or interference with contractual relations

Maura undeniably broke a specific law on behalf of her friend and co-defendant. Oh wait, I haven't mentioned both friends are co-defendants in a federal racketeering lawsuit, have I? It is true.

Case 1:17-cv-11939.

I protested to Judge Rosalind Miller that Maura broke a specific law. Judge Miller ruled that she was perfectly okay with it. This is Massachusetts after all.

I sent certified mail to state officials responsible for governance. Just like Michigan State University's in-house counsel Kristine Moore ignored Larry Nassar's victims for years, they haven't cared. I informed the AGO's Counsel Richard Johnston that he must end statutory violations by the AG. I wrote to State Auditor Bump. All stayed silent.

State Treasurer Deborah Goldberg's office told me they cannot block unlawful expenditures by the AG and that I should contact Comptroller Thomas Shack. I already had. His CTHRU website says Loretta is no longer a state employee. After two weeks of messages via email, certified mail and Twitter, the comptroller's people finally wrote they could do nothing about the AG spending tax money to violate state law. That is why we spend \$8.8 million on the comptroller, get it?

I filed a criminal complaint with Essex County D.A Blodgett. It is just sitting there, soon to vanish.

What all these named state officials have made clear is one undeniable fact. The Massachusetts elite are untouchable and may break state law and spend tax dollars at will, and not one of these named officials will stand up and say 'Stop breaking the law.'

Thanks to them all, Loretta now enjoys life amongst the Inner Party elite, with all three branches of state government committed to breaking a state law to protect her at public expense though she lied to the police.

document the reasons for his impending firing, usually without severance payment.

This cruelty hardly ever happens to a truly incompetent employee. Incompetents who care little about anything work related make great so-called "group players" and are more likely moved to less demanding positions by employers than being fired. In short: incompetence and blindly "playing along" may be the best protection against being bullied at work.

But will the Globe expose all this to the public? Will the paper disclose the multitude of binding relationships many employers have with state agencies such as the Executive Office of Labor and Workforce Development (former DET) to the detriment of employees? This Office known to support employers and often denying unfairly ousted employees unemployment benefits, useful to both the EOLWD (in not having to pay) and the employer in maintaining low unemployment insurance rates (as rates increase with every unemployment benefit awarded). Similar favors are exchanged between employers and dozens of other state offices, including the MCAD, authority on discrimination, which is known for its own discriminatory practices.

Add to this unequal playing field the fact that proper legal representation is rarely obtainable by middle income employees and if obtained, usually involves a single practice lawyer who is easily swamped by the routine shenanigans and harassment tactics of corporate law firms representing the employer. Now fast forward to the customary destruction and alteration of evidentiary documents

at courts of law up to the SJC (Supreme Judicial Court) to manipulate cases when favoring the culpable party. And this naturally followed by refusals of clerks to produce these doctored files when requested.

Recent official assurances by Secretary of State Galvin, that Public Documents would be made more readily accessible through the Keeper of Records at his Office have also proven to be mere smoke screens to appease the public. The truth is that while his Keeper of Records can be useful in obtaining records, his office only monitors wrongdoings and does not enforce corrections of mishandled files. It works like the Lifelock commercial where people are told by those expected to correct calamities that they merely monitor, not cure, them, leaving those stricken to their doom. Unlike this hilarious commercial, the reality for those suspended in the purgatory of the Massachusetts judiciary is everything but, with nowhere for them to go for relief.

Which is why it may be preferable to not bother with waiting for the Boston Globe to rise to its duties or effect change. But for us, the people, to individually deal with this systemic disorder in Massachusetts by employing appropriate forms of revenge to attain justice. Aply suggested by Thane Rosenberg* in his persuasive evaluation of acceptable responses to moral injury in "The Case for Revenge."

two weeks later and the mom was crying at the wake saying 'I should have done something, I should have listened. So the best advice I can give is that what we see with these addiction problems, especially with opioids is that three or four times going to rehab is not unusual. Nobody is getting clean once, kicking it and going on with their life. So, you have to understand that there are going to be some failures involved, but you have to reach out and you have to reach out early. Get them in these programs. Get them on the radar screen so that they have a fighting chance to beat this. If you don't, if you think you can handle it yourself, you absolutely cannot handle a family intervention and do it yourself. It's not going to work.

CHIEF GRAY: Don't judge. Don't allow a stigma to influence your judgment as far as not going for help. We don't use the term "junkies" any more. They are addicts. We do that to try and take away the stigma of having that battle.

DUGGAN: "So, I shouldn't use junkie anymore then?"

CHIEF GRAY: "Uh, no. That's one of the reasons the stats on this are under-reported. They are afraid to call for NARCAN, they are afraid to call and say someone overdosed. I've talked to a lot of the officers who go on these calls and they say that 'the person just dropped.' If it's heroin or fentanyl let us know. Let us take care of it. Don't worry about the stigma that you think is going to go with it.

When Paul adopted Goldy he had already spent half of his life as a cat that was allowed outdoors. Although Goldy loves to snuggle with Paul on the couch, he also enjoys his time roaming in the yard. He is an avid hunter and he loves to spend time hiding in the grass like a Leopard on the Serengeti. Goldy goes outside at will during the day and spends his nights indoors. He has lived this indoor/outdoor lifestyle for years and he clearly enjoys it.

Janine owns 3 cats. All of her cats were adopted and all 3 cats also enjoy an indoor/outdoor lifestyle. Her cats are young and full of energy and spend all day playing, hunting, and roaming at free will in Janine's generously sized yard. Janine lets her cats out in the morning and they return at suppertime each day. That is until last September. One evening last fall only 2 of Janine's cats came home for dinner. The third cat is still missing to this day.

Everywhere I go I see "missing cat" posters. In addition, I see tons of Facebook posts about cats that are missing and I also hear of many missing cats via word of mouth. Most of these cats never return. In fact, only about 15% of lost cats ever make it home. Clearly, cats like Goldy enjoy being outside. But if you let your cats outside, you are undoubtedly putting your cat's life at risk.

Indoor cats enjoy much longer lives than outdoor cats. The average indoor cat lives to be about 15-17 years old. The average outdoor cat lives only 3-5 years. Cats that are allowed inside and out are usually somewhere in between depending on a number of different factors.

Cats that are allowed outdoors are at much greater risk of injury and death than indoor cats. Motor vehicles pose a huge risk for cats that are outside. According to the National Traffic Safety Administration, 5.4 million cats are struck by cars every year. Predators such as coyotes and foxes, and other cats and dogs all pose threats to cats that roam outdoors. Cats that are



free to roam are at risk of poisoning from pesticides and antifreeze. Poisoning can occur either accidentally or intentionally. Outdoor cats are also subject to many forms of cruelty and abuse. Other people may not share your fondness for cats and may intentionally hurt your pet. Cats have been shot with arrows and BB guns, hung from trees, kicked, burned, poisoned, and used as bait for dog fighting.



Outdoor cats are also subject to serious infectious diseases such as feline leukemia, and to a variety of parasites including fleas, ticks, and worms. When they come in at night, they bring these parasites in with them. Besides getting hurt, cats may be stolen or picked up by well-meaning individuals and brought to an animal shelter.

By far the easiest way to protect your cat from potential hazards or from becoming lost or stolen is to keep your cat indoors. If you do have an indoor/outdoor cat, then take precautions like microchipping your cat and using a breakaway collar with an ID tag. Limit your cat's outdoor excursions to the daytime and treat regularly for fleas and ticks. Make sure your pet is spayed or neutered.

Keeping your cat indoors can be the best decision you can make for your cat. Indoor cats can be both safe and happy and can live very long lives. Besides, who wants to find a dead mouse on the doorstep?

To Get Healthy, Start from the Inside

If you're like me, you see yourself and judge yourself from the reflection you see in the mirror daily. There is more to our health than what our reflection tells us or what is being seen as a number on the scale. The best place to look is inside you, where all the magic is happening behind the scenes. Many things that you feel going on with your body like aches, pains, inflammation and swelling starts with what we are putting into our bodies and eating on a daily basis.

Did you know that the foods we eat daily can change the makeup of your body and the way we feel in our everyday lives?

Let's talk about pH Levels in our body. The pH level is one of the most important balance systems of our bodies. The term pH stands for potential of Hydrogen. It is the amount of hydrogen ions in a particular solution. The more ions, the more acidic the solution. The fewer ions the more alkaline the solution. The pH level is a measure of acidity or alkalinity, on a scale of zero to fourteen, with zero being most acid, fourteen being most alkaline and seven being mid-range. The most critical pH balance is in the blood.

We all should strive to have an alkaline based body, but is yours too acidic?

Are you feeling drained, irritable, do you often have headaches or dry skin and hair? One of the things I suffered from was muscle cramps and inflammation of my joints. These are just some of the common ailments of having excessive levels of acid in our bodies, and not everyone knows that the acidic pH level of our body is causing it. It's best to not test first thing in the morning as your urine will be different and not an accurate measure. Once you see your levels, it's time for changes!

I'm sure there are plenty of supplements or prescriptions you could be prescribed, but the easiest way (and most cost effective) is simply diet. Not necessarily being on a diet, but changing our diet to more alkaline based foods. The top ten of those are: garlic, red radish, lemons, tomatoes, spinach, cucumbers, avocados, celery, broccoli and wheat grass. Almost all of the green vegetables are great like: kale, alfalfa and zucchini (my personal favorite). Now you don't only have to eat only these vegetables, just incorporate them more and more into your diet. To really eliminate the excessive amounts of acid in your blood, tissues and organs, a huge fraction of your diet should consist of these alkalizing foods.

Buddy Holly was born on September 7, 1936 in Lubbock Texas. His birth name is Charles Hardin Holley.

When Holley turned 11, he followed in the musical footsteps of his brothers and sister, and took piano lessons. After nine months however, he quit the piano and grew interested in being a guitar player after being impressed by a classmate. His parents got him a guitar, and Travis, his brother taught him to play the instrument.

Buddy became friends with Bob Montgomery when he was attending the Roscoe Wilson Elementary School. When Holley got to high school, he played with Sonny Curtis, and Jerry Allison. By 1952, Holley teamed up with Jack Neal to perform in a talent show on television as Buddy and Jack. In 1953, Jack stopped performing and was replaced by Montgomery. Buddy and Bob as they were called performed on radio station KDAV on Sunday mornings, and performed live in Lubbock.

When Holley graduated high school in 1955, he wanted to make a career out of recording music. He started recording songs on the Decca label, but he didn't stay with Decca for long. He would have recorded more of his songs on the Decca label, but the record producer wanted a traditional country sound that adults would approve of, but Holley wanted to make rock 'n' roll records. On the first single that Holley recorded 'Blue Day, Blue Night', Decca records misspelled his last name and from that point on, Buddy Holley was known as Buddy Holly.

After leaving Decca records, Holly went to Clovis New Mexico to meet with producer Norman Petty. There, they re-recorded 'That'll Be The Day' with the rock 'n' roll sound that Buddy wanted. The demo tape was sent to Brunswick records in New York. The label quickly released the demo on May 27, 1957 under the group's name The Crickets due to a five-year argument with Decca that didn't allow any songs that Holly recorded on Decca to be recorded on another label. Brunswick liked the sound of the group so much that an agreement was made to let Holly use his musical talent on later songs entirely.

Since legal clearance was granted by Decca to let Holly record on other labels,

keeping up with what label goes with what song or album became confusing to the fans. If you look at the record labels that Buddy Holly and Buddy Holly and The Crickets were on, you'll notice that all songs that were credited to the Crickets were released on Brunswick, while songs that were credited to Buddy Holly were released on the Coral label.

In August of 1958, Holly married Maria Elena Santiago. Holly asked to marry her on their first date. To keep his female fans happy, the marriage was kept secret.

Santiago acted as both mother and secretary to the band while they were on tour. She cleaned the laundry and maintained the instruments. As a secretary, Santiago booked the shows and handled the money since Norman Petty wasn't paying Holly or the other band members. Holly hired lawyer Harold Orenstein to figure out how much money he and the band members were supposed to receive from Petty. To help get Holly money, a promoter from New York named Manny Greenfield booked concerts for him. Greenfield received 5% of Holly's earnings. Later, Holly was sued by Greenfield because some of the money he made was out of state. In December of 1958, Holly cut ties with Petty and the Crickets. Since Petty was still holding Holly's money, Holly had no choice but to go back on the road touring and create a new backup band.

In December of 1958, Holly put together a backup band that would perform with him on the Winter Dance Party tour. The band members included Waylon Jennings on bass, Tommy Allsup on guitar, and Carl Bunch played drums. On January 23, 1959 the tour started in Milwaukee Wisconsin. On February 2, they made their second stop on the tour playing at the Surf Ballroom in Clear Lake Iowa. Due to unhealthy conditions, Holly decided to fly to the next tour stop in Moorhead Minnesota. Tragically, Buddy Holly, Richie Valens, and the Big Bopper died when the airplane crashed a few miles away from the Mason City Iowa airport at 1:00 AM on February 3.

Amazon's 'Marvelous Mrs. Maisel' Lives Up To Its Name

Amazon's terrific new series 'The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel' was created by Gilmore Girls creator Amy Sherman-Palladino and her husband David Palladino, and stars Rachel Brosnahan in the title role.

Miriam "Midge" Maisel is a young Jewish homemaker living in her Manhattan apartment with her husband Joel and their two children in the 1950s. By the end of episode one she quickly becomes the former Mrs. Maisel after she learns that her husband is leaving her for his secretary. Midge develops an interest in stand-up comedy because Joel liked to perform at a club in the Village after work. But getting on the stage isn't something she thought of for herself. One thing leads to another and Midge ends up behind the mic and she quickly realizes that she is very good at it.

She meets Susie (Alex Borstein), who is the bartender/manager of the club. Susie instantly sees the potential in Midge and quickly moves in to help educate her in the art of show business. Her education is also helped along by comedian Lenny Bruce, played by Luke Kirby. Lenny and Midge form a bond over their comedy and their struggles with the obscenity laws of the era.

After her marriage falls apart, Midge moves back in with her protective parents, played by Tony Shalhoub (Monk), and Marin Hinkle (Two and a Half Men). Midge wants to be independent and gets a job working at the makeup counter of a department store. She also keeps trying to pursue her career in comedy, all while trying to keep it a secret from her family

at the same time. It proves very difficult the more popular she becomes.

Great writing and great performances are everywhere in this series. Brosnahan (House of Cards) is charming as Midge, and her work is not going unnoticed. She has already taken home a Golden Globe and Critics Choice Award for her role. She plays both the happy housewife and naughty comedienne to perfection. Shalhoub is also excellent as Midge's father, and Kevin Pollak is hilarious as Midge's father-in-law. But the real standout is Alex Borstein as Susie. Borstein, who also provides the voice of Lois on 'Family Guy', steals every scene she is in. Her scenes with Brosnahan are gold.

Where the series really excels is in its crisp, well written dialogue. The conversations that take place between all of the characters, especially Midge and Susie are prime examples of top notch writing.

The writers are also careful and take their time to develop Midge, slowly getting her out of the house and onto the stage. If they were to rush it and make Midge an overnight star, it just wouldn't be believable. Midge may have stumbled into a career in comedy, but as viewers we're happy she ended up there.

Young Bloods Fugitive Steven C. Touch Arrested

Last night at approximately 7:30 p.m., the FBI's North Shore Gang Task Force and the Massachusetts State Police Special Tactical Operations Team arrested Steven C. Touch, in Lynn, Massachusetts. Touch is an alleged leader of the Young Bloods, a violent street gang operating in and around Lynn. Touch is scheduled to appear in Middlesex Superior Court later this morning.

On June 15, 2017, Touch, also known as "Kevin Touch," "Fat Boy," and "C Sick" was indicted by a grand jury in Middlesex County, along with two other associates for his involvement in a 2012 home invasion in Billerica, Massachusetts resulting in the murder of the victim. He is charged with murder in the first degree, home invasion, attempt to commit armed robbery, and two counts of conspiracy. Prior to that, an arrest warrant was issued on January 10, 2017 by Middlesex Superior Court for Touch, after he failed to appear in court on the following charges: possession of a large capacity firearm, possession of firearm without a license, possession of a large capacity feeding device, carrying a loaded firearm, and defacing a serial number on a firearm. Subsequently, on May 22, 2017, another arrest warrant was issued for him out of U.S. District Court

in Boston, Massachusetts for Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution.

Following his capture, Touch was taken to the Lynn Police Department, where he was booked and was later transferred to custody of the Billerica Police Department.

Last June, the FBI's North Shore Gang Task Force announced it was offering a monetary reward of up to \$10,000 for information leading his arrest. However, no reward money will be paid.

The North Shore Gang Task Force along with the Massachusetts State Police Violent Fugitive Apprehension Section and local police officers searched intensively for Touch, who was believed to be moving from address to address frequently.

No further information is being released at this time. All further inquiries should be directed to the Middlesex District Attorney's Office.

The FBI's North Shore Gang Task Force is composed of the following agencies: the FBI, the Massachusetts State Police, Massachusetts Department of Correction, the Essex and Suffolk County Sheriff's departments, Boston, Chelsea, Lawrence, Lynn, and Revere police departments.

Capitalizing on a Growing Global Economy

George Washington understood a key principle about public debt: It is a tool to be used when necessary, but not to the detriment of future generations.

Unfortunately, the United States has significantly strayed from this principle.

In his Farewell Address, Washington said: "As a very important source of strength and security, cherish public credit. One method of preserving it is to use it as sparingly as possible . . . not ungenerously throwing upon posterity the burden which we ourselves ought to bear."

Since the start of this century, there has been an immense increase in the national debt. Key factors included expansion of health care programs, tax cuts, military conflicts, the Great Recession, and an aging population with millions of Baby Boomers leaving the workforce.

The debt is now at its highest level, relative to the size of our economy, since World War II. Federal deficits -- the difference between government spending and tax revenue each year -- are rapidly growing. The Fiscal 2017 deficit totaled \$666 billion, and in the very near future we could return to \$1 trillion deficits. This time, however, such large deficits are projected absent an economic crisis; no Great Recession to blame.

George Washington declared that elected leaders should carefully manage the nation's debt, and that the public should support efforts to use the debt wisely and then pay it off. The founding father also emphasized that after crises or conflicts that might require a debt buildup, there should be a "vigorous exertion" to pay it down.

Everyday Americans often express alarm over the country's high debt. And polling by a variety of organizations often reveals the understanding that our current fiscal trajectory is not a sustainable one. Perhaps it is time to put that concern into action, and encourage elected officials to start making the tough choices that are necessary.

Congress has ignored Washington's advice for years, often relying on budget gimmicks, overly rosy economic growth projections, deficit spending and the postponement of essential reforms.

Lawmakers find ways to work around mechanisms like budget caps and "pay

as you go" policies that were intended to keep the federal budget on a sustainable path.

One of federal lawmakers' fundamental charges is to put together and approve 12 appropriations bills each year to fund the government. This process has repeatedly broken down, leading to fiscal cliffs, stopgap measures, threatened or actual government shutdowns, and omnibus bills—large, rushed spending packages that often receive too little scrutiny and rarely establish solid, long-term priorities.

When the budget process broke down in 2017, lawmakers again relied on stopgap measures that looked only weeks or months ahead, as they were preoccupied with political expediency and the need for a "legislative win" in the form of a lopsided tax code overhaul.

Our first president would likely decry efforts to reduce tax revenue in the face of mounting debt -- one of the likely results of the new tax law. In fact, we can take Washington's word for it. He noted that "towards the payment of debts there must be revenue; that to have revenue there must be taxes; that no taxes can be devised which are not more or less inconvenient and unpleasant."

Instead of making matters worse, this Congress might leverage what has been a steadily growing economy to enact needed reforms to chart a more responsible course on the debt and engage in long-term planning on necessary government programs like Social Security and Medicare.

Real reform would entail tough choices that bear generational ramifications in mind, simplifying and making the tax code more efficient in at least a revenue-neutral manner, managing per capita and long-term costs in health care and retirement security, working to reduce budget deficits, and stabilizing the national debt.

George Washington and more than a few of his successors helped build up a Yankee Doodle nation to a global leader. Members of Congress should now be about leading and leaving a responsible legacy; otherwise, perhaps they should just consider leaving.

Vietnam Campaign Medal, Vietnam Civic Action Award, Presidential Unit Citation, Meritorious Unit Citation, and the Combat Infantryman Badge.

Major Kelley is qualified to wear the converted Ranger Tab, the Vietnam Jump Wings, and the U.S. Army's Master Parachutist Wings, a rare qualification. According to the U.S. Army; "The Master Parachutist badge (with a star surrounded by a laurel wreath above the canopy) requires 65 jumps (night, combat equipment, mass tactical, as jumpmaster), 36 months on jump status and graduation from a Jumpmaster course". Most of us, would not jump out of an aircraft once, let alone 65+ times, with Infantry gear on, and at night?

His career in the U.S. Army included two tours in Vietnam, a tour with the famed 82 Airborne, the 7th Special Forces Group; it was with the 7th Special Forces that Rick completed his first tour

in Vietnam, serving on the border of Laos and Cambodia, where he worked with the Rhade Tribe in the Central Highlands of Vietnam. He served in Japan with the 1st Special Forces, on Okinawa. He then completed his second tour of duty in Vietnam. Two of his later assignments were instructor duty at Fort Devens, Massachusetts, then his final tour with the U.S. Army Recruiting Command in Boston, Massachusetts.

After retiring from the U.S. Army, Rick practiced law for 33 years, while living in Andover with his wife Marilyn and his family. It is here that the story will continue next month, in the March issue of the Valley Patriot. Rick has been serving his fellow Veterans on the Board of Directors for the Northeast Veteran's Outreach Center in Haverhill, Massachusetts since 1985. DEP Fines Safety-Kleen Systems in Salisbury for Hazardous Waste, Underground Storage Tank Violations

Company Works to Address Violations and Bring Facility Back into Compliance

BOSTON – The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) has penalized Safety-Kleen Systems, Inc., in Salisbury (a Wisconsin-based company), \$75,575 for environmental violations found during routine inspections of the company's licensed hazardous waste treatment storage and disposal facility at 90 Rabbit Road in Salisbury.

"MassDEP will strictly enforce the regulations pertaining to the safe and proper management of hazardous waste facilities in order to protect public safety and the environment," said Eric Worrall, director of MassDEP's Northeast Regional Office in Wilmington.

The hazardous waste violations found during the May and June 2017 inspections included: the leak-detection system sump sensor was not installed properly; the spill bucket was not in good operating condition; personnel had not been properly trained; hazardous waste containers

were not properly marked as stipulated in the applicable regulations; and, certain records were incomplete or not available when requested. In addition, the underground storage tank spill bucket and tank-top sump had accumulated liquid in them.

After the violations were brought to the attention of Safety-Kleen, the company corrected the physical components and provided MassDEP with documentation demonstrating that equipment repairs had been made, the labelling was corrected and a commitment to training and record-keeping was in place.

Under the terms of the consent order, Safety-Kleen will pay \$60,375 of the penalty and \$13,200 will be suspended provided there are no further violations over the next year.

MassDEP is responsible for ensuring clean air and water, safe management and recycling of solid and hazardous wastes, timely cleanup of hazardous waste sites and spills and the preservation of wetlands and coastal resources.

Elizabeth Warren, Introduces Bill to Prevent 'Forum-Shopping' in Bankruptcy Cases

Washington, DC - United States Senators Elizabeth Warren (D-Mass.) and John Cornyn (R-Texas) today introduced the Bankruptcy Venue Reform Act of 2017 to ensure corporations file for bankruptcy in districts that allow small businesses, employees, retirees, creditors, and other stakeholders to fully participate in cases that will have tremendous impacts on their lives.

"Workers, creditors, and consumers lose when corporations manipulate the system to file for bankruptcy wherever they please,"

said Senator Warren. "I'm glad to work with Senator Cornyn to prevent big companies from cherry-picking courts that they think will rule in their favor and to crack down on this corporate abuse of our nation's bankruptcy laws."

"Closing the loophole that allows corporations to 'forum shop' for districts sympathetic to their interests will strengthen the integrity of the bankruptcy system and build public confidence," said Senator Cornyn. "I urge my colleagues to support this bipartisan, common-sense solution to ensure equal access to the courts in bankruptcy proceedings."

Background:

The Bankruptcy Venue Reform Act of 2017 would prevent the practice of forum shopping in Chapter 11 bankruptcy cases and ensure fairness in the bankruptcy system by:

- Requiring individual debtors to file for bankruptcy in the district where their domicile, residence, or principal assets in the United States is located;
- Requiring corporate debtors to file for bankruptcy in the district where their principal assets or principal place of business in the United States is located;
- Corporate debtors would no longer be permitted to file simply on the basis of their state of incorporation.
- Stopping debtors from filing for bankruptcy in another district simply because an affiliate of the debtor has filed there; and
- Requiring that courts transfer or dismiss cases filed in the wrong district.

The Bankruptcy Venue Reform Act of 2017 is endorsed by the Commercial Law League, Texas Bankruptcy Bar Association, Texas Hotel & Lodging Association, Boston Bar Association, Ag & Business Legal Strategies, and Iowa Bankers Association.

MA Man Convicted of Receiving Firearms Intended to Murder Judge, Former A.G.

CONCORD, N.H. – Acting United States Attorney John J. Farley announced that late Tuesday afternoon, a federal jury found Edward McLarnon, 69, of Malden, Massachusetts, guilty of receiving firearms with intent to commit murder, as well as three related weapons and explosive charges, after a six-day trial.

Evidence presented at trial showed that in October of 2015, McLarnon made contact with a person he believed to be an arms dealer (who was actually an undercover FBI agent) for the purpose of buying illegal weapons. McLarnon negotiated with the undercover agent at a store in Chichester, New Hampshire and paid a total of \$700 in cash to obtain the weapons. On November 6, 2015, the defendant took possession of a .22 caliber pistol with a silencer, an AK-47-style semi-automatic rifle, ammunition, and two hand grenades containing high explosives at a rest stop in Seabrook. He was taken into custody shortly after taking possession of these items. The evidence further showed that McLarnon intended to use the weapons to kill his ex-wife's husband, as well as a Boston federal judge, and a former Massachusetts Attorney General.

The jury found the defendant guilty of: (1) receiving an unregistered silencer; (2) receiving firearms with the intent to commit murder; (3) receiving explosive materials; and (4) receiving an explosive with the intent to harm persons or property. He faces a maximum penalty of ten years in prison for each count of conviction. He will be sentenced on May 10, 2018.

"I am grateful to the jury for rendering this swift and just verdict," said Acting

U.S. Attorney Farley. "The evidence at trial demonstrated that the defendant devised a frightening plan to use weapons to kill several individuals to express his frustration with the legal system. Thanks to the hard work of the brave law enforcement officers who participated in this investigation, the defendant's violent plan was stopped before anyone was hurt."

"Edward McLarnon purchased an AK-47, grenades, a silencer, and ammunition with the sole intent of killing the former Massachusetts Attorney General, a sitting federal judge, and other government officials. Today's conviction ensures that Mr. McLarnon will not be able to further endanger innocent lives," said Harold H. Shaw, Special Agent in Charge, Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Boston Division. "This case is a testament to the tireless efforts of the FBI's Joint Terrorism Task Forces in Massachusetts and New Hampshire, where the close coordination between federal, state, and local law enforcement led to the successful disruption of McLarnon's

plot. Each and every day, the Joint Terrorism Task Force strives for a perfect record, and we'd like to thank all of our partners for their dedication and hard work in bringing this case to a safe and successful conclusion."

This matter was investigated by the FBI, U.S. Secret Service, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives. The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney John S. Davis and Special Assistant U.S. Attorney Matthew T. Hunter.

This is a break from my usual reviews.

I know a few people who are bipolar, I thought reading this book might help me to understand them and their illness better.

The book started off thin from the beginning. As an advance copy, there were still some grammar mistakes. It appeared the book was in need of a good editor. But, since it was the message that was important, I continued reading.

This book is a good starting place. One is given rudimentary knowledge of the condition. One thing I did really like about this book is that one does not have to be bipolar to gain benefits from the book's information. Many insights the author gives into her coping mechanisms can be utilized in one's everyday approach to life. Nutrition, exercise, meditation are all modalities that we can all profit from.

I would like to impress upon people that if one is truly bipolar, or one suspects they or a loved one is bipolar that one should seek the help of a qualified mental health professional at least for an evaluation and diagnosis if not outright treatment and medication.

Some chapters, like Chapter 2 “Early Warning Signs” is a disappointment. There is not even one full page and the author tells us of one warning sign and states that she doesn't know of any others. Maybe she should have checked with family members, maybe they could've provided insight and if not, at least she could have told us that she'd made the effort to do so, with no success. I found this lack of research troubling and hoped that it was not a harbinger of things to come. I read on. My opinion upgraded in Chapter 3

“Defining Bipolar”. What makes this book different from others in this genre is that Blythe is totally honest regarding her condition, how it affects her, her family, and her relation to them and the world in general. I found this very personal view important for my understanding.

At the end of each chapter, the author gives “Action Steps”. These are associated with that segment's topic. This means of reinforcing her material is quite useful. One valuable suggestion is to write down the things that were amazing that day and to be grateful for them. Fantastic insight and tip! She also suggests creating boundaries for oneself and to accept oneself, warts and all. Again, these methods are not, and should not be, confined to those who are bipolar.

There were a few drawbacks that the author is aware of. There are terms, like SSRI, that she mentions being prescribed but does not say what these letters mean or the type of medication it is. Then she mentions being attracted to MLM's. I don't have a clue in hell what this is. Very annoying. If ones point in writing a book is to give info then do so. Don't hide behind the alphabet. Blendtec is another term that requires a Google search since it isn't (wasn't) explained.

This book an admirable attempt. And, I also found the author, Blythe Edwards, genuinely caring and concerned for those who have this same illness. At the end of the book she gives her email address (balancingmybipolar@gmail.com) and tells the reader to contact her with questions, comments, etc.

Despite obvious flaws, I would still recommend this as a starting point for anyone who is looking for further understanding specifically into bipolar and generally into ones own self-awareness.

Cues from a Higher Source

To call this place a town was a bit of a stretch. But it had a name. It was approximately 10 acres dotted with a few dwelling structures too poor to be called houses. This was a farming community, a back lot of a larger regional municipality. And this is where she came from.

She was poor, uneducated, young- maybe 14 or 15. She spent her days making or mending clothes, cooking, cleaning and the highlight of the day was to leave her humble squalor to go down to the single well. There she could draw water but also engage in conversations with other women. There was excitement in her life though. She was betrothed to an older man. An arrangement by consent of both she and he was made and approved by the families. Now all that had to happen was to wait the customary time frame; typically a year or two, before she would become a bride. He was a provider. A man who feared God; respected in the community. His word was gold. He was humble, able to care for her and a blessing; indeed a rare find. He was her ticket out to a better life.

But all of this would be interrupted. Unearthly designs on the young girl would dislodge her from her perceived certain path in life. A stranger visited her and informed her of stunning news. She was pregnant. With child but not by a man. Her world suddenly turned upside down.

What could she tell the man who had made a commitment to her? What would the women say at the well? How could her life suddenly careen from a guided path to a bewildering one? Was this a curse or a blessing?

The only control she now had in her life at a moment's notice was a decision to make. The stranger did not demand anything of her. In fact, he was there to obtain her consent to embark on a life's journey

that she could not fully understand at that moment. At that moment she acquiesced. In coming weeks her betrothed, who himself was visited by a stranger in a dream understood his fate and complied to a startling new plan for his life he hadn't designed either. The rest is history whether real or contrived depending on one's perspective.

Yes; this is the story expressed in the Gospel of Luke of Mary and the Annunciation. The girl from Nazareth. To Muslims and Christians who revere Mary, this is monumental intervention in the affairs of mankind. For people of other faiths or no faith this is at best a fable at worse a cruel hoax.

At the risk of being accused of sneakily trying to proselytize christianity the point I want to make here that even in this accounting of a woman from a different age with few choices and limited means she was utterly respected. The Angel Gabriel did not visit her with a decree but an offer seeking consent.

We have witnessed in recent weeks with disturbing frequency and acceleration an increasing litany of immoral and criminal transgressions committed by powerful men against women. These men by their thinking were above commonly acceptable behaviors and even the law and were not held to standards that required respecting anyone. Yet whether God is real to you, or not it doesn't matter. The universally understood story revealed that even God had the good sense to ask a woman's permission about something that affected her before just making the decision for her- or unilaterally imposing His will. And who is more powerful than God?

Certainly not the men who have extinguished their extraordinary accomplishments in their fields, destroyed reputations and families by illuminating their dark side.


